Don't Dump Your Old Computer, iDevice

If you have old equipment cluttering your space, Apple may have a deal for you.

Equipment, such as iPhone, smartphone, iPad, Mac, or PC, that isn't too old may possibly be turned in for an Apple Gift Card. Or an old iPod may be exchanged at an Apple Store for 10 percent off a new one.

Of course, there are restrictions, and so forth, and quite possibly your model may be too old for reuse. But, at the least, Apple will recycle oldies for free, including free shipping.

Check out the Recycling Program at: Apple.com > search “recycle” and choose Apple Recycle Program > on the next page, click Get Started under the appropriate program feature.

Moving to Photos

Main points:

What's Gone:

- Conversion from iPhoto will not work if not updated to 9.6.1
- Loss of event and photo names, mail tool, editing in video.

What's Changed:

- Interface, same filters, controls and effects as iOS.
- Photo library, stars have been turned into hearts/favorites.
- Events to Moments,
- Straighten is now Crop.
- Metadata shows up in research.

Migrating Your iPhoto Library

- Before opening Photos, if you have an operating iPhotos, repair your library (See iPhoto/Photos Library Repair).
- When launching the Photos app for the first time, it goes looking for an iPhoto or Aperture library. If it finds one, it imports it.
- If you want to reimport your iPhoto Library at any time, just Quit Photos, delete the Photos Library, reopen Photos and select the iPhoto Library.....

Backup first-Do not interrupt the process.

Did you know?

iPad tips-

Hidden apostrophe key on the keyboard

This is a great tip for any app, such as Notes, Pages or Mail, that you type into using the iPad's virtual keyboard. Rather than having to go to the second screen of the keyboard every time you want to type an apostrophe (which is a real pain) just tap and hold on the ! key and a hidden apostrophe option will appear - then just slide your finger up to access it.

Quick quotes

You don't have to move the iPad's second keyboard screen to enter a quotation mark either. Simply tap and hold over the ? key and a quotation symbol appears, which you can select by moving your finger upwards.

Just deleted an email by mistake?

Shake iPad, then tap Undo.

Switch to other keyboards

You can install more keyboards than the standard one — for emoji, other languages, or keyboards such as BrightKey. In the Apple Store, find the keyboard you want to use and download it. Go to Settings > General > Keyboard. The keyboard you downloaded should appear.

To switch keyboards when you're typing an email or a note, etc., tap or hold down the next keyboard button (looks like a globe) whenever the keyboard appears.

For Macs:

DetectX is a free application (MacUpdate.com) that will seek out malware on your computer so it can be deleted.

Folder Forge v1.5.3 and Folderol v2.0 are applications from the Apple Store (\$6 each). These applications allow one to colorize and add images to folder icons so they can be located at a glance.

XtraFinder is free from <http://www.trankynam.com/xtrafinder>. A powerful application which can re-establish the old full-width tagging appearance of files and add many useful features.

For iDevices:

Brightkey keyboard is free from the the app store. It's most useful feature is the ability to slide a finger across the space key to move the curser within the text.

Waze is free from the app store. It is a terrific navigation tool with very accurate maps and the ability to get real-time hazard warnings, email tracking data to friends, find nearby gas prices and other cool stuff.

Artrage from <http://artrage.com> or the app store for \$5. (The full Mac version is \$50.) This is a very realistic artist's canvas with all sorts of tools and brushes and infinite paint colors. Terrific for one's creative side. And its endorsed by member Pat Roof's grand kids.
